Poland - Key Facts



Area: 312 700 sq km – 6th in European Union

Population: 38,5 million – 6th in European Union

Currency: Polish Zloty (1 USD ~ 3.0 PLN, 1 EUR ~ 4.2 PLN)

GDP: USD 802 billion (PPP, 2012) – *IMF*

USD 840 billion (PPP, 2013) – IMF estimates

GDP USD 21,310 (PPP, 2012) – *IMF*

per capita: USD 22,373 (PPP, 2013) – *IMF* estimates

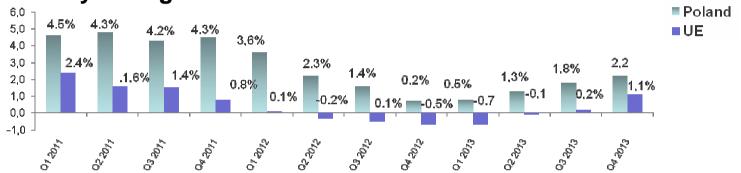


2000 km radius 550 m people

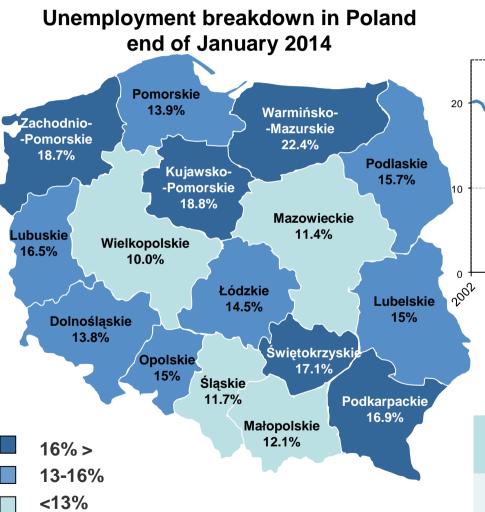

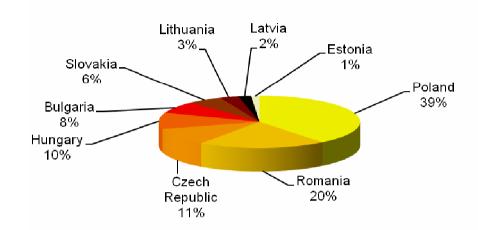

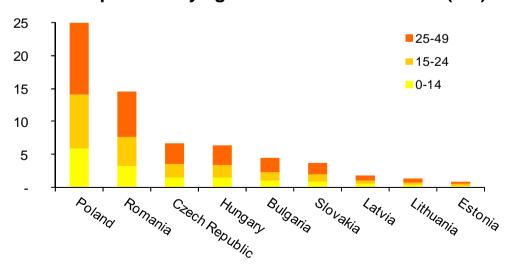


Human resources availability

Population of CEE countries (%)

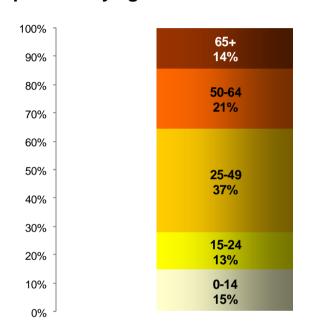


Population by age classes CEE countries (mn)

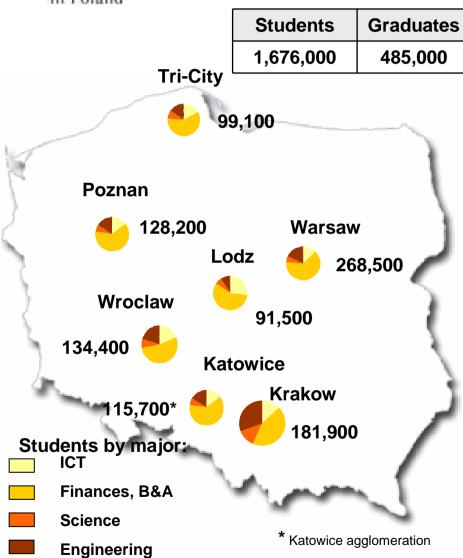
Population by age classes in Poland (%)

- 10.7 m Poles are less than 25 years old



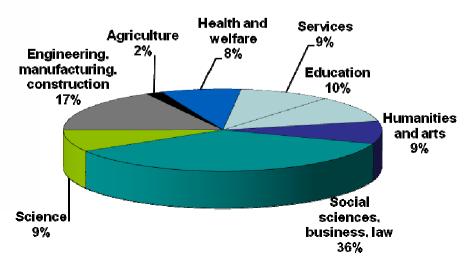

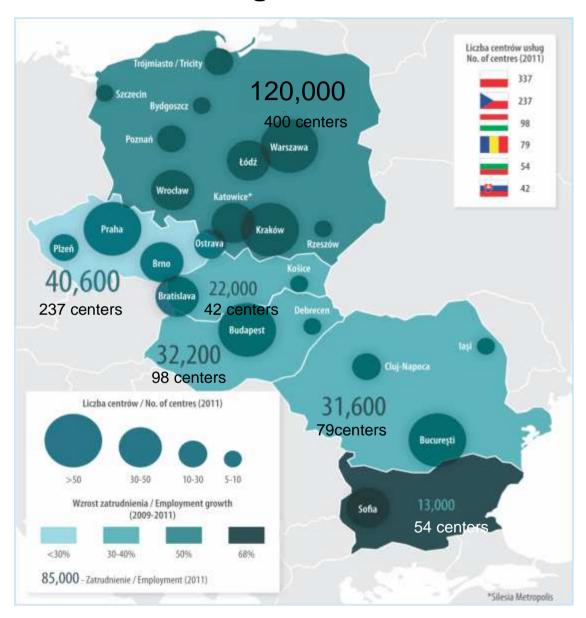

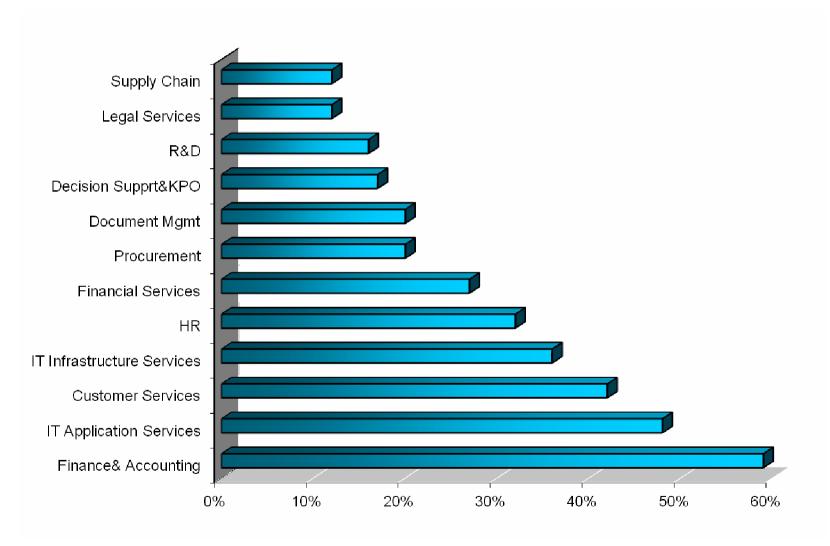

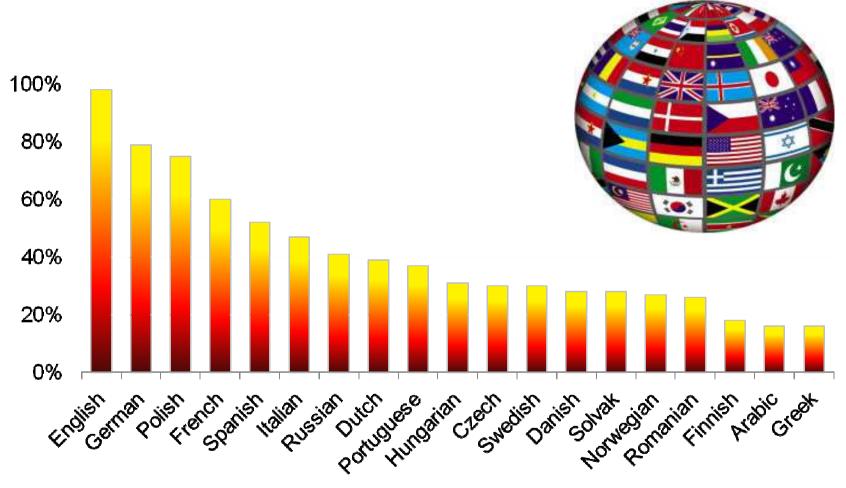
Business services – scope of operations

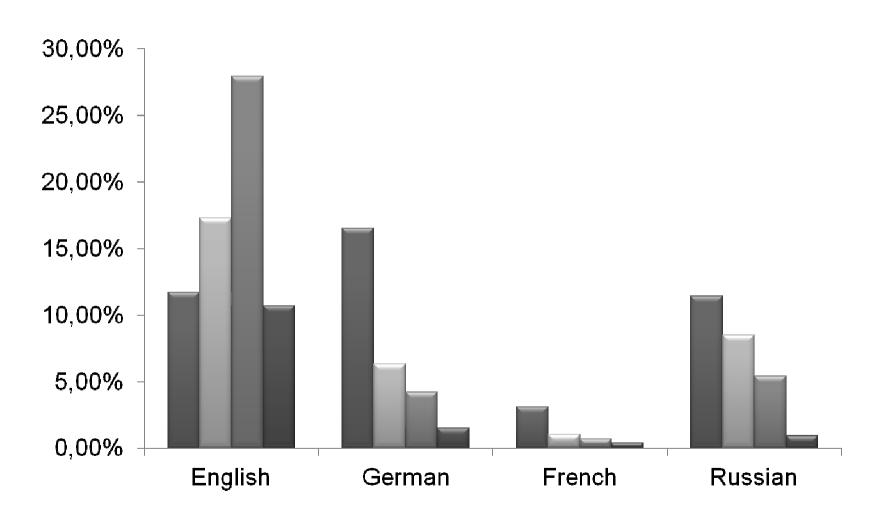
Languages in business centres

Success of Polish ICT sector (1/2)

Poland is 5th biggest ICT employment market in Europe

High availability of highly-skilled programmers is a crucial factor attracting foreign companies to Poland.

400,000 employees in Polish IT industry

In contrast, the number of right skilled software developers in the Western Europe is decreasing



By the 2020, only in Poland and Germany the number of IT proffesionals will grow among the EU countries



Success of Polish ICT sector (2/2)



Polish IT students won 21 awards in Microsoft's Image Cup since 2002, including 7 main awards.

Project supported by the Ministry of Economy and PAlilZ

4 already existing ICT locations in Poland: Gdańsk (marketing purpose), Poznań (business suport), Kraków (LAB Center launched in 2010), Wrocław (3,600 FTE's - in 2014)

August 2013 - launching of the Delivery Centre in Katowice - approx.

2,000 jobs (!). The centre provides high-value information technology services covering the full range of hardware and software solutions used by clients headquartered in Europe.

2013, under the local expansion programme, the company has opened regional sales offices in Katowice, Wrocław, Kraków, Poznań and Gdańsk.

Cooperation with Silesian and Lower Silesian academic centers, giving students the opportunity to participate in the development of the most advanced programmes as cloud computing

Reasons for selecting Bydgoszcz: access to well-educated labour force, lower labour costs comparing to other Polish cities, modern office space, enthusiastic attitude of the regional authorities and assistance offered by them for the investor

Case study of Luxoft - supported by PAlilZ

2010 - first inquiry from the company

Detailed packages of information about several potential locations in Poland including Krakow

One location visit only to Krakow – meetings with business partners

2010 - launching of the software centre in **Kraków - 200 jobs** provides application and product development services

Next stage of analysis for the expansion purpose

Selection of Wroclaw for the second IT centre – approx. 40 jobs – the company applied for EU Funds

PAIIIZ provides further market information towards next Polish locations – Łódź and Tricity potentially

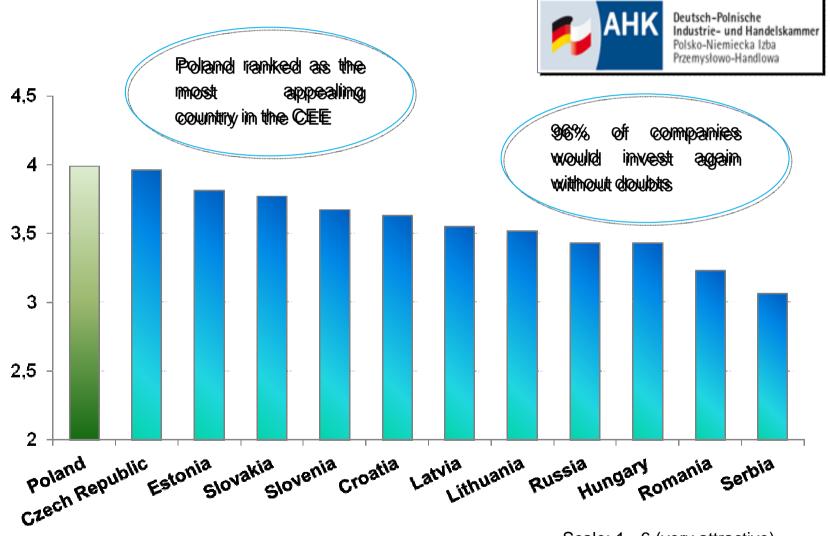
